Visipore Mats: 1 sheet of fabric and 4 "earth staples" 36x36 in. \$2.00 _____
Mats allow water in, retard evaporation, keep weeds down. A must in grassy areas.

Seedling protection tubes: 4 in. x 24 in. \$1.50 _____
Tubes protect plant leaders from deer browse. Each comes with one bamboo stake.
